Letter from the Rector of the Burghill Benefice

Dear All,

TRANSFORMATION

The change of one thing into another is amazing. I have always found it mesmerizing how a caterpillar turns into a butterfly or moth. It is really indescribable how one creature morphs into something completely different with very different abilities. I also find it equally fascinating how elements are transformed into other elements. Through extreme pressure and heat, Iron, Gold and the heavy elements are created out of other things. I don't pretend to know much about chemistry, but the way things transform into other things is astounding. In many ways, I think of nature and the wider universe as a kind of magic show and as we look and explore further, we wait for the next trick the universe has to play. Understanding the way things emerge and transform from creation is one thing, but transformation also comes from things that are unseen and unobservable, and I'm not talking about the quantum realm. Transformation comes in different forms and change happens in so many ways. For example, you may change your mind, or discover something new that means something to the way you live. It could be a health issue, a philosophical issue or something else. You may discover something about yourself or someone else. It could be either good or bad, it depends what impact it has upon you or others.

I think about this in terms of the Christian faith, because central to its message is about change and transformation. At Easter, the dead Jesus is, like the caterpillar, metamorphosized - transformed into something beautiful and new. This for Christians is not a result of nature, but super-nature. The God who made the show enters the stage Himself and displays Himself for humanity to see. Yet, the transformation is not about a show of power, but rather a confirmation that change has entered the world. That the outcome of mortality has changed, and change calls for further changes, namely our lives and the way we live them. In May we celebrate the festivals of Ascension and Pentecost, the days we remember Jesus returning to Heaven and sending His Spirit upon the fledgling Church, an assembled group of witnesses.

This outpouring of His Spirit is the day we remember as the Church's birthday, that day when they were changed from observers into active participants. The day they became agents of the world's change. Telling people that their lives mattered and that they were and are loved by God who sent Himself into a world to change it. We all have a duty to change and transform ourselves and the world around us, and there is still much to do. So do something for others, be the change and transform something into something better.

**THE EDITED DRAFT MINUTES OF STRETTON SUGWAS PARISH
COUNCIL (SSPC) MEETING HELD IN STRETTON SUGWAS (SS)
VILLAGE HALL ON THURSDAY, 21st MARCH, 2024**

PRESENT:

MINUTES:

The minutes from the last meeting held on 18th January, 2024 were adopted as a true record of those meetings.

PUBLIC FORUM:

- One local resident was concerned about the road safety of the A438 between Swainshill and Kings Acre Halt near the Breinton Lane junction. There have been a number of accidents and near misses with, more recently (12/01/24) an accident resulting with a hospital A&E admission. The resident:
 - Has consulted other residents along the road towards Hereford and has been made aware of a number of instances of excess noise resulting from lorries and motorbikes, and possible speeding vehicles.
 - Mentioned the danger of crossing the road due to the bend and limited visibility and using narrow footpaths next to the road which is stopping her from walking her children to school.
 - Has collected a number of signatures from residents concerned about the road safety.
 - Asked the PC to discuss with HC/(Highways Agency the possibility of (1) reducing the speed limit from 40 - 30mph (2) the installation of speed cameras, and (3) the installation of Speed Indicator Devices (SID's).

Andrew F advised that Garnet C was in the process setting up a Community Speed Watch (CSW) team and once the vetting of the participants has been completed, will be able to monitor vehicle speeds through the village.

The PC will:

- review the installation of SID once the CSW is up and running.
- are also in the process of installing white gates and further road markings which is hoped to make road users more aware of the speed limit along the A438.

Bob M suggested contacting Mike Gill to request any overgrown hedges along the A438 be cut back.

Ward Councillor Matthews advised of ongoing consultations regarding a Hereford bypass on the west side of the city and 7,000+ new houses in the surrounding

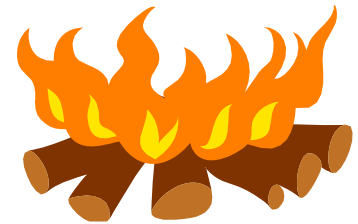

- fields along Kings Acre Road. Also, additional funding is available for footpaths and drainage issues - see Schemes/Funding - Drainage

PLANNING APPLICATIONS:

Application 240133 - The Lakes, Swainshill. Variation of condition 4 following grant of application P191554 - Amendment to position and reduction of house size plot 10 - PC confirm no objections.

Appeal of refusal of planning 230727 - 2 dwellings between Rose Cottage and Great House. PC still have no objections to this request and will submit further representation stating that the allocation for new properties submitted in the Neighbourhood Plan has already been exceeded.

D-DAY CELEBRATIONS:

Garnet C has contacted the school to ascertain if they want any involvement in the celebrations. John R and James CH have investigated the lighting of a beacon and found the Health & Safety conditions make it too complicated to continue. Due to the lack of interest/participation, it was decided not to continue with this project.

UPDATING THE POLICE CHARTER:

PC confirm top 3 community issues remain unchanged.

SCHEMES/FUNDING:

- Lengthsman and funding 24/25 - PC to budget £500
- PROW 24/25 - The PC made aware of additional £250k funding for minor projects/refurbishment of stiles and gates. Andrew F is the Footpath Officer and continues to monitor the footpaths in the parish. He understands that there is to be a survey of the Wye Valley Walk to ensure the footpaths are being maintained.
- Drainage 24/25 - HC is launching a new Local Drainage Fund (LDF) to address local highway drainage issues. PC to submit an expression of interest with the following issues identified:
 - A438 between Kites Nest and Turnpike Cottage
 - Church Road - between church and speed limit sign
 - Church Road bend opposite entrance to Barnsfield
 - Church Road junction at Travellers Rest

Garnet C to liaise with EN.

SPEED INDICATION DEVICES/ROAD MARKINGS/WHITE GATES:

- The PC wish to install SID and will consider possible locations along the A438 once the CSW is up and running.
- west of Swainshill, adjacent to the 40mph signs). Balfour Beatty have been contacted and a site visit is to be arranged.
- White Gates installation - a site has been identified (towards the boundary

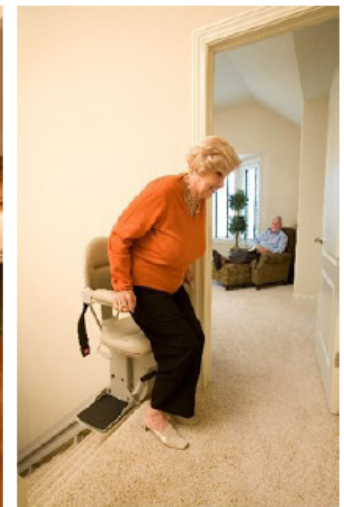

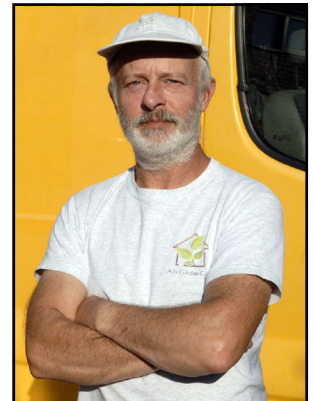

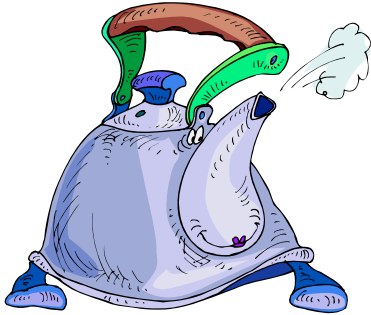

In addition, we're actively working on maintaining the village's accessibility for everyone. Our dedicated volunteers have already demonstrated how enhancements can be made. As the initial or final tier of Government (depending on one's perspective), we value your input on local matters. Our meetings take place every second month at the Village Hall, and we encourage public participation.

To date, our accomplishments include the planting of nearly 100 trees, the installation of a fence at the Copse, to keep everybody safe the purchase of two benches, and various other endeavours. We always welcome community members to join our meetings and contribute to our collective efforts.
