**Letter from Associate Minister in Charge -  
Reverend Penny Littlewood**

Dear Parishioners,

And so the time has come . . . . . on the 31<sup>st</sup> October I shall attain the age of 70 and am therefore obliged to retire as your Minister in Charge! Wow, where have the years gone? I have informed all the Churchwardens that I do not wish the fuss and work of a big farewell in any form, however, my last official Sunday service will be at a Joint Group service in Burghill at 10.00 am on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October, so it would be really super if as many of you as possible could attend so that I can have the opportunity of wishing you all well for the future.

I will not be disappearing completely, as I do have our Bishop's permission to conduct my last wedding of the year in Stretton on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December and in due course when I've enjoyed my obligatory six months break, I shall apply to the Bishop for a PTO licence (Permission to Officiate) which means I become a sort of 'flying minister'; taking services anywhere in the Diocese whenever and wherever there is a need at times of holiday or sickness, etc. Just like all those other retired clergy who have stepped in to help me when I've struggled to be in two places at once. It does mean, of course, I will be able to pick and choose what fits in with whatever my future life holds – more time with hubby for one thing.

What I do want to say to you all though, is that it has been an absolute pleasure to be your minister in the last years since Jimmy retired. I have met some wonderful people; been welcomed and encouraged by your friendship and faith. I especially wish to pay tribute to members of the Parochial Church Council for all their hard work on behalf of the church and the community, and particularly to our two superb churchwardens, Shirley Williams and Beryl Andrews. Their friendship and dedication have been unbelievable and have contributed enormously to making my job so much easier.

I suspect many will be asking 'what happens next?' Well, there is a system in place for working towards future ministry in our group, so please rest assured the churchwardens of this church and the other three in our group are actively working with our Rural Dean and the Archdeacon to progress the process. Sorry to say it isn't a speedy process, but it is important the right minister is found, therefore your patience and support now and in the future is greatly appreciate. In the meantime, thank you and God's blessing upon you all.







This November, hundreds of postcards created by artists across Herefordshire and beyond will go up for auction. All of these works of art have been devised for free by a talented range of exhibitors as part of St Michael's Hospice's Postcards from Life event.

The artwork will also be available to view online ahead of a three-day exhibition of the work at the Bishop's Palace in Hereford from November 10 – 12.

Entries depict country houses, animals and idyllic rural sketches, among other subjects.

'I'm delighted that such a wonderful array of artwork will again be showcased at the Bishop's Palace,' said the Bishop of Hereford, the Right Reverend Richard Frith. 





**Until 30th December**     *Magna Carta Exhibition*

During this second part of the year, we are displaying our 1217 copy of Magna Carta in the Mappa Mundi and Chained Library Exhibition chamber, to celebrate its 800th anniversary. The 1217 Charter brought to an end, a civil war in England that the more famous 1215 Charter had failed to conclude. It was the first to be called “Magna” (Great), to distinguish it from the smaller Forest Charter published alongside it. The cathedral possesses one of only four surviving official copies of the 1217 Magna Carta. It is too fragile to be on permanent display although it did go on a 37,000 mile world tour in 2015, when it was seen by 25,000 people.

The Forest Charter which would have accompanied the Charter is lost, but we are displaying a late 13th century copy, kindly loaned by the Herefordshire Archive and Records Centre. Open Mon - Sat - normal exhibition admission charges apply.


