**Letter from Associate Minister in Charge -  
Reverend Penny Littlewood**

Dear Parishioners,





The club was set up by a small band of volunteers who thought that we all feel a bit lonely at times and would like a nice to have a bit of company, a light meal and a chat. And we felt that it should be **affordable!**

We are quite independent of any organisation i.e. the church, village committee etc.

#### **The event is open to:**

**ANYBODY** (anyone who would like to come along)

**ANY AGE** (all ages, we must have some young mums with youngsters that might like a bit of company)

from **ANYWHERE** (not just for people of the village). We have people who regularly attend from all over the county!

It has been running for over 7 years now and we have had in excess of 40 of us for much of the time. Over the years a number no longer come for various reasons and sadly many are no longer around.

The lunch is at Stretton Sugwas Village Hall starting at 12.30pm every 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month (watch out - some months do have 5).

We do not have a lunch in the hall in September but have a meal out, as some of our volunteers are involved organising the harvest meal that month, we also have a Christmas lunch with children from the school entertaining us and a summer outing. These are subsidised from profit from our raffle, so are by ticket only and these are sold at earlier lunches at nominal costs.

**You** are most welcome to just turn up on the day. It is useful but not compulsory, if there are a few of you, to give us some idea how many you are a few days before for catering purposes.

### Annual Canvass 2016

Each property in Herefordshire will be receiving a "Household Enquiry Form" in mid-September, as part of this year's Annual Canvass. This form will list all registered voters and asks households to confirm if correct, or add new people or remove people who have moved out.

It is a legal requirement that each household completes and returns their Household Enquiry Form, whether there are changes or not. Anyone in the household aged 18 or over can complete the form for the whole household. It is easy to do and you can complete via phone, text, internet or post – the choice is yours. Full and clear instructions are on the form.
