Letter from the Rector of Burghill Benefice

Dear All,

THE GARDEN AND THE GARDENER

In the beginning of the Bible we have the famous poem of Adam and Eve, which tells us about how God sees our role in the world and our abilities (or lack of) to fulfil what God requires. You know the way it goes, a snake, forbidden fruit and they blew it. Nevertheless, the first role of human beings (as Adam is everyone) is to be a gardener, a steward of this world, not its possessor. Native American Indians could not get their heads around the Europeans idea of owning land. They thought it a bit like fleas arguing about who owns the dog. Yet, there is something healing and healthy about being in the garden and being a gardener. I have always played with being a bit of a dabbler in the garden, but lockdown real gave me an incentive to become a gardener in its fuller sense.

During Lockdown and the past two years, I found that I had more time at home and more time to do other things. The problem was that though I had more time, I had little rest. Having time doesn't mean you have rest. Rest is what we need and having time on our hands doesn't mean that you have rest. What I found in the garden and in gardening was that I could switch off my mind and get off the mental merry-go-round. I can think of many people that are sat around all day for various reasons who need a break because they have little rest-time. I think often in stories we can miss the obvious. The story of Adam and Eve tells us that a life of bliss is one in which we have a purpose which refreshes us and stills the soul. The garden is also a place, for me, of wonder. When I look at a flower in bloom it makes me wonder and appreciate how wonderful creation is. The beauty of it is insane! The complexity and the intricate delicacy of blooms are simply wonderful. It tells us that what God has brought forth is a generous gift, a peal beyond price and we are a part of this great mystery called life. This appreciation takes us beyond ourselves and stills us by putting things into context. Well, that is what it does for me.

So, this summer, get out there and toil, find out about things in the garden and take up the challenge laid down before us. Get in the garden and be God's gardener!

GARDENING IN JUNE

Summer arrives

June 21st is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an exuberant burst of growth. But this extra light and

warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions.

TOP 10 JOBS THIS MONTH:

1. Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside
2. Be water-wise, especially in drought-affected areas
3. Pinch out side shoots on tomatoes
4. Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes
5. Hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds
6. Mow lawns at least once a week - but consider leaving some areas uncut for wildlife
7. Plant out summer bedding
8. Stake tall or floppy plants
9. Prune many spring-flowering shrubs
10. Shade greenhouse to keep them cool and prevent scorch

General Maintenance:

Flowers: Hoe borders to prevent annual and perennial weeds from spreading and seeding themselves.

Tackle bindweed when it appears in a border

Lift clumps of forget-me-nots once the display wanes, and before too many seeds are released as they can become invasive if left unchecked.

Stake tall perennials to prevent wind damage to flower spikes.

Sweet peas need training and tying in to their supports to encourage them to climb and make a good display.

Liquid feed containerised plants every 2 to 4 weeks.

Keep tubs, hanging baskets and alpine troughs well watered. Use collected rain-water, or recycled grey water wherever possible.

Pot on plants showing signs of being root bound.

Trees and Shrubs: Ensure newly planted trees and shrubs do not dry out.

Loosen any tree ties that are digging into the bark, or could do so soon as the trunk girth expands/

Sprinkle fertiliser around perennials, shrubs and roses.



WHAT IS COURIER FRAUD?

Courier fraud occurs when people are duped into handing over money or valuables to criminals posing as couriers. Using a variety of different tactics, usually involving the impersonation of police officers and bank staff, criminals will call the victim and convince them into withdrawing a sum of money and handing it over to a courier who is sent to their home. The victim may be also convinced into handing over their bank cards, PINs, as well as high value items such as jewellery, watches and gold (coins or bullion).

Recent reports to Action Fraud have highlighted a sharp increase in instances of criminals instructing victims to purchase high value items such as jewellery, gold coins and gold bullion.

This advice will help individuals protect themselves against falling victims to courier fraud.

What you need to do:

- **YOUR BANK OR THE POLICE WILL NEVER** call you to verify your personal details or PIN. If you get a call asking you to do this, hang up, wait a few minutes and call your bank on a number you know to be genuine, such as the one on the back of your bank card.
- **YOUR BANK OR THE POLICE WILL NEVER** send a courier to your home to collect your cash, bank cards, PINs or any other valuable goods. Any requests to do so are part of a scam.
- **THE POLICE WILL NOT** contact you out of the blue and ask you to participate in an investigation that requires you to withdraw money from your bank, or to purchase high value goods, such as jewellery or gold.

What to do if you've been a victim of fraud:

- If you've revealed your bank details over the phone or handed your card to a courier, **call your bank straight away to cancel the card.**
- If you suspect that you've been a victim of courier fraud, **report it to Action Fraud by visiting actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.**

Editor: You can now also dial **159**, a new emergency hotline for people to report and check financial scams as they happen. It is being promoted by Stop Scams UK - a coalition of banking and technology companies. If you think you are being scammed, hang up. **Ring 159 from another phone or if you haven't another phone, wait 30 minutes before dialling.** You will be put through to your bank and can find out if they have contacted you.


