## Letter from the Rector of Burghill Benefice

Dear All,

### ***LOVE WINS!***

The origins of Easter have bedazzled me since becoming a Christian. In all the New Testament, it is the central feature that transforms the entire story. The wounded risen Lord standing before the doubting Thomas is a powerful image. In response to what he sees, he surrenders and exclaims: “My Lord and my God” (Jn 20:28). But let us rewind a little. Just a few days before, Thomas and the other men who were very much looking forward to seeing their leader, Jesus, installed as the world leader. In his success, theirs would follow. They were going to bathe in the glory of His power. All this is true of course, but it didn’t turn out as they had hoped. Jesus was, betrayed, humiliated, beaten and tortured to death on a Roman cross. He was powerless in the face of worldly power; or so it seemed.

When I look back, very little of life ever turned out the way I expected it, and yet, for the most part, in strange ways, they did. Wisdom comes *via* experience not knowledge, and there is no greater knowledge than that of love. Not frothy love, the sort you find expressed on the pencil case of a student, but life changing, undying love, a transforming fire that burns within the heart. To the Church I say that if your reading of Scripture doesn’t increase your love for God and other people, then you are reading it wrong! Love is what life is about - it makes the world go around. Think of your family, would you endure them at times for anything less than love? That I doubt! Love forces us to go beyond our own interests so that they become invested in others. The disciples, as brave as they weren’t, received the risen Christ in unbelief. Well, can you blame them? Nevertheless, what they received from Jesus was not worldly power or privilege but undying love. That is what Easter is about, the victory of love over all things, even death. The New Testament says: “God is love” (1 Jn 4:8), it restores all things (Acts 3:21). Locked in the upper room in which Jesus appears before them, afraid and full of anxiety love stands before them and shows them the cost of it, in His hands and his side. The famous hymn says: “Love is come again like wheat that springeth green”. Love is wounding, death defying, wonderful; love wins!

**MINUTES:**

The minutes from the last meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 were adopted as a true record of that meeting.

**VIEWS OF PARISH MATTERS RECEIVED FROM LOCAL RESIDENTS:**

- A report had been received regarding an increase in dog fouling. This will be added to the Agenda for the next meeting.

**WARD COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:**

Cllr Matthews reported that there:

- is likely to be an amendment to the number of houses, 50% less than originally proposed, on the development of Three Elms Road, this is due in part to the western bypass route no longer proceeding.
- confirmed the Southern Link Relief Road will no longer happen.
- has asked Herefordshire Council to consider that the first floor of the multi storey car park at the Bus Station be reserved for NHS staff.

Parking charges in the city are likely to go up and he is opposed to this.

**PLANNING:**

- 6.1 Application 210504 Land at the Lakes - reserved matters following outline approval 191554 - outline approval for plots 1 - 8 and design barn on plot 9. Full approval for proposed road to the development and for plot 10, approval of details and layout, scale, appearance, access and landscaping to Plots 1, 6 & 7. The planning Steering Group visited the site and the following comments were agreed by all those present and will be submitted by the clerk: the PC objects strongly to the current application. None of the concerns raised at the previous hybrid application have been addressed.
  - For example, the proposed slab level of the house on plot 6. The floor level will be perched on made-up ground above the original land profile (which slopes steeply towards the eastern boundary). The excess soil at the north-east corner of the site, immediately adjacent the corner of the churchyard, derives from the deposition of soil from the rest of the development.
  - The floor will be some 2m above the eastern boundary ground level and



- the churchyard corner and 3m above the adjacent field (as per levels shown on the client's survey).
- The house itself is will tower above the corner of the churchyard and destroy the ambience of this sacred and historic site. (Photo attached to the original minutes)

And it is not acceptable to consider plots 1, 6 & 7 without details of the rest of the site. In the current application, house elevations are shown individually as being on level sites without any reference to the rest of the surroundings. This is a false representation.

- Neighbourhood Plan:
  - Policy SS1 Protecting Sensitive Landscapes - Development should be designed to take account of local topography
  - Policy SS4 Building Design Principles and Protecting Heritage - para 2 New development should be of a scale, mass and built form which corresponds to the characteristics of the site and its surroundings

To comply with these policies, it is necessary to see a full landscape interpretation across the site. This would include sections through the whole site from east to west and north to the churchyard showing the relationship to adjoining land. This cannot be achieved by focussing solely on plots 1, 6 & 7.

- Historical Note:

When the workshop was originally granted planning approval, the PC were assured that the fields behind would not be built on and a Section 106 development restriction was placed on these fields.

In January 2016, a further workshop block behind the present one was approved (There was no associated documents from this approval). In order to achieve this, the Section 106 Development Restriction was revoked, but not until June 2016, 6 months after planning approval! This was done without any evident correspondence to the PC.

If there is any doubt about the accuracy of this objection, the PC would be pleased to meet the planners on site.

## **FINANCE:**

7.1 Clerks salary as determined by agreed pay scale - ACTIONED. GC asked if it was necessary to document this at every meeting but it was confirmed to be a condition in the Financial Regulations that all payments are documented.

- **Surface Water drains along side Brockall Wood on the A438:**

Raised by Balfour Beatty prior to the meeting. The clerk raised the following under delegated powers as the correspondence had come in after the Agenda had been posted.

**Church Road Footpath and road markings:**

Andy Byng had been in touch to say that as the road was due to be resurfaced, it would seem sensible to implement the previously agreed road markings to improve road and pedestrian safety. Gates and white lines were previously agreed. There were concerns that this may divide the village and gates would be more beneficial at the beginning and end of the village rather than just on Church Road. This was noted but it was agreed to continue with the current plan and reviewed. The clerk will contact Andy Byng to implement the agreed works.

**10 Broken Stile:**

- To note the stile along the footpath from Stretton Sugwas to the top of Breinton Common (possibly SS11C) is broken (reported by local resident). It was confirmed that although broken, the stile was still accessible and could still be used. The clerk confirmed that it had been reported to Balfour Beatty for action.

**11. POLICIES:**

- To consider adopting the Environment Policy (emailed prior to the meeting). It was proposed and seconded and all agreed. It will be visible on the website. GH asked for more information on the accessibility of websites as the PC were not aware of the recent change in regulations. This will be explored further. GH has emailed a quote from a local website company. All present thanked GH for her work on the website and will assist in any way they can. It was agreed to add this to the agenda for the next meeting.
- To consider adopting the Finance Regulations Policy (emailed prior to the meeting). Agreed by all. The clerk will forward to GH for inclusion on the website.
- To consider adopting the Standing Orders Policy (emailed prior to the meeting). Agreed by all. The clerk will forward to GH for inclusion on the website.

**CORRESPONDENCE:**

- Core Strategy Settlement Hierarchy Settlement Review - this was completed during the meeting and the Clerk will submit to the Neighbourhood Planning Team at Herefordshire Council.

**STRETTON SUGWAS,  
WITH THE HAMLET OF SWAINSHILL.**

STRETTON-SUGWAS is a small parish and village situated on the main roads leading from Hereford to Hay and Kington; is distant 4 miles N.W. of Hereford, and about 1½ S.E. of Credenhill station on the Hereford, Hay, and Brecon branch of the Midland railway. It is in Grimsworth hundred, Hereford union, petty sessional division, county court district, and polling district. The population in 1861 was 209; in 1871, 272; inhabited houses, 54; families or separate occupiers, 71; area of parish, 767 acres; annual rateable value, £1,826. The Governors of Guy's Hospital, London, are lords of the manor and principal landowners. The Rev. H. Cooper Key, M.A., F.R.A.S., and the Exors. of the late Edward Russell, Esq., are also landowners here. The soil is loamy; subsoil, gravel; chief produce, wheat, barley, beans, fruit, and excellent cider and perry. Stretton-Sugwas is in the diocese and archdeaconry of Hereford and rural deanery of Weston. Living, a rectory; value, £250, with residence and 24 acres of glebe; patrons, the trustees of the Rev. H.C. and Mrs. Key; rector, Rev. Henry Cooper Key, M.A., of Christ Church, Oxford, who was instituted in 1846.

The church, dedicated to *St. Mary Magdalene*, was restored in 1847, but wants repair and enlargement. It is a plain edifice, consisting of nave and chancel, with a wooden tower at the west end containing four bells. It contains some interesting Norman carving; also a Norman font. The register begins with the year 1733. The churchyard is planted with evergreens and other trees, and is kept in very nice order. There is a national school, for boys and girls, under government inspection. It has a certificated mistress, and an average attendance of 50. **Swainshill** is a hamlet, situated on the Hereford and Hay road, about 1 mile S.W. of the church. At **Sugwas**, which is near this parish, was a palace and chapel belonging to the Bishops of Hereford. This was the principal residence of Bishop Cantilupe, and was last inhabited by Bishop Ironsides, at the conclusion of the 17th century. Sugwas Pool formerly occupied an area of 7 acres; it is now nearly dried up, and there are a few cottages in its neighbourhood.

**POSTAL REGULATIONS.**- Mrs. Eliza Stevens, *Sub-Postmistress*, Swainshill. Letters arrive by mail-cart from Hereford at 7.15 a.m.; despatched thereto at 6.10 pm. There is a wall letter-box at King's Acre, which is cleared at 6.15pm. Hereford is the nearest money order and telegraph office and post town.

*Parish Church (St. Mary Magdalene).*- Rev. Henry Cooper Key, M.A., *Rector*; James Powell, *Churchwarden*; James Jones, *Parish Clerk and Sexton*.

*National School (boys and girls).*- Mrs. Maria Stodart, *Mistress*.



## FROM THE RHS WEBSITE GARDENING ADVICE FOR APRIL

### Sunshine & showers

Spring is finally in evidence as daffodils and flowering trees start to bloom. Expect the inevitable April showers this month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month, with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing indoors. Just watch out for frosts.

#### TOP 10 JOBS THIS MONTH:

1. Keep weeds under control
2. Tie in climbing and rambling roses
4. Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wild flower seed outdoors
5. Start to feed citrus plants
6. Increase the water given to houseplants
7. Feed hungry shrubs and roses
8. Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
9. Prune fig trees
10. Divide bamboos and water lilies

#### Other jobs to do - general maintenance:

##### Trees and Shrubs:

- **Evergreens** - In cooler areas, and earlier in the month, you can still move and plant evergreen trees and shrubs, provided the soil is not waterlogged. They are best moved or planted once actively growing and when there is less risk of cold weather.
- **Deciduous** - In colder areas, you can also still plant container-grown hedging plants, shrubs, trees and climbers. Stakes and rabbit guards should be put in place at time of planting to prevent damage to the root ball and bark. You may be better delaying planting large plants until next October.
- **Feeding/mulching** - Mulch rose and shrub beds with a 2 - 3" layer of organic matter, to help retain moisture, reduce weed build-up and improve soil structure. Feed trees, shrubs and hedges with a balance fertiliser, sprinkling it over the root area before hoeing into the soil surface.

##### Flowers:

- Put supports in place for perennials before they get too large.
- Apply a general-purpose fertiliser to borders and beds
- Top dress spring-flowering alpines with grit or gravel
- Remove faded daffodil and tulip flowers, nipping off the heads and seed pods at the same time. Deadhead pansies, primulas and other spring bedding plants.
- Remove tired winter bedding and plants that did not survive the winter. Hoe borders to prevent annual and perennial weeds from spreading and seeding.
- Containers: top up with fresh compost. Check if plants are pot-bound.




